Now Open! The LMPN Peru Medical Center inside the YMCA

The formation of a new partnership in 2021 was built into reality by February of 2022. The Miami County YMCA in Peru, Indiana had embarked on a capital campaign to construct a new facility for its organization. In that effort, they were seeking a healthcare partner that could provide services on-site for YMCA members and the overall community. Logansport Memorial Hospital was pleased and privileged to be part of that partnership, officially relocating and reopening our Peru Medical Center inside the new Miami County YMCA this year.

The existing clinic location for Logansport Memorial's Peru Medical Center on Logansport Road had continued to grow and serve Miami County since its opening. Clinic volumes were outgrowing the current space and relocating inside the Miami County YMCA provided the opportunity to increase access to the primary and specialty care services that were already part of the Peru Medical Center. Additional exam rooms and more space for upgraded imaging equipment and lab draw services now enhance the scope of primary and specialty care that can be provided on-site at the clinic.

"This project has been an exciting and necessary investment in the health and wellness of Miami County residents," said Rachel Theodore,

Vice-President of the Physician Network for Logansport Memorial Hospital. "We were eager to make this additional investment and commitment for the patients that we currently serve and could grow to serve here. Logansport Memorial's mission is to be 'the region's partner in both wellness and treatment,' and this opportunity has allowed us to fulfill that in a new way. We are grateful and proud to be the premier healthcare partner of Miami County, working with the Miami County YMCA to expand and enhance the access to necessary healthcare services right here at home."

"Our organizations share similar goals in finding ways to improve the health status of the communities we serve. Tenured primary care providers Dr. Stephen Kennedy and nurse practitioner Sharon Cooley are still accepting new patients and are available most days of the week for appointments. Dr. Kennedy is a family medicine physician who accepts patients as newborns through adults and seniors. Sharon Cooley is an internal medicine nurse practitioner who accepts patients ages 18 and older.

For additional access to primary care, Dr. David Beeson is one of the newest providers to join the Logansport Memorial Physician Network this year, and provides same-day or next-day sick visits and acute primary care for patients as needed.

Family medicine nurse practitioner and Peru native Stacie Stutzman has also relocated to the Peru Medical Center and is accepting patients of all ages by appointment only. Stacie also specializes as a provider in the Logansport Memorial Office-Based Addiction Treatment (OBAT) Program. This program is a comprehensive approach that can help patients achieve recovery from substance use and/or opioid addiction. It uses a safe, controlled level of medication with ongoing care and monitoring from office visits to overcome the use of a problem substance.

Expanding our Therapy Services Program

Logansport Memorial Therapy Services also has its own clinic space inside the Miami County YMCA. Physical therapy services were being offered in the limited space at the previous Peru Medical Center location, and now with a much larger footprint, more patients can access the physical and occupational therapy services they need in maintaining or improving their quality of life.

Logansport Memorial's Therapy Services team uses YMCA facility equipment during some sessions, to help with demonstrating how to do any recommended exercises for strength and conditioning safely and on your own after the series of therapy sessions is completed. Having an option for physical or occupational therapy that is convenient to where a patient may already be exercising can make a difference in recovery, or in returning to or continuing with activities they love to do.

Growing to meet the needs of the communities we serve is at the heart of everything we do.

Therapy services that include physical, occupational, and speech therapy are valuable treatment options for a variety of conditions and injuries. Providing access to all three types of service across the communities we serve was a growth priority for 2022.

"We have an exceptional team of providers in our Therapy Services department," comments Rachel Theodore, Vice-President of the Physician Network, Sports Medicine, and Workforce Health. "They have worked hard and worked together this past year to grow our volumes tremendously. Because of their commitment to providing high-quality care, we have been able to serve patients across all age ranges and in a few areas of specialized service as well."

The clinical expertise in our Therapy Services program includes:

- Pre-and Post Surgery Care
- Work and Accident-related Injuries
- Sports-related Injuries
- Back and Neck Injuries
- Total Joint Replacement Rehabilitation

Specialized areas of clinical expertise include:

Vestibular Rehabilitation

designed to decrease dizziness and vertigo for those who struggle with keeping their balance

Postpartum Corrective Exercises

exercises to help address core and pelvic floor issues, restore loss of muscle strength and function, and address postpartum pain

Pediatric Feeding Therapy

helping children who experience feeding and swallowing difficulties, or who experience sensory difficulties in eating

Completing the 2022 Community Health Needs Assessment

A new roadmap for impacting community health needs

A Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) is a systematic process involving the community to identify and analyze community health needs. The process provides a way for communities to prioritize health needs, and to plan for how to address unmet community health needs. As the local healthcare provider and partner for Cass County, Logansport Memorial leads this effort every three year. Completing a new assessment builds on successes from the past and imagines new possibilities for the future.

When Logansport Memorial conducts the CHNA, we use a variety of methods to gather data and input from key stakeholders. Phone call surveys are made throughout the county with a list of questions asked that gauge individual health status, recurring health needs, and barriers to accessing healthcare.

Online surveys and interviews with community leaders are also held to build a high-level, strategic overview of what some general community health needs might be.

Once the surveys are complete, the data is analyzed and prioritized to produce a full report on the health status of our community. For most of our previous CHNAs that have been completed every three years since 2013, the focus has been specifically on Cass County's health status. In 2022, LMH expanded the assessment to include a report for Cass County and for Miami County, based on the growth of access to services that had taken place between 2019 and now.

Logansport Memorial Hospital and the Community Health Needs Assessment taskforce chose to focus on these five priorities for our three-year implementation plan:

- 1. Mental Health
- 2. Nutrition, Physical Activity, and Weight
- 3. Substance Abuse
- 4. Access to Health Care Services
- 5. Infant Health and Mortality



Goals, objectives, and timelines are further defined in the 2022 implementation plan—also available on the LMH website.

To make an impact on these health needs will require collaboration, innovation, and community-wide commitment. The LMH CHNA taskforce is positioned to address these needs with each of those things and the work will continue until 2025, when progress is summarized and measured

and it's time for another assessment to be completed.

"Providing Community Benefit is at the heart of our stated mission, which is to be the region's partner in both wellness and treatment," comments Sherri Gehlhausen, Chief Financial Officer for Logansport Memorial Hospital. "We also have a responsibility to serve and care for everyone who walks through our doors. You'll notice that a large part of our community benefit comes from charity care, bad debt expense, the unreimbursed costs of Medicare, and our Medicaid shortfall."

"The healthcare industry is unique in how providers collect payments from multiple sources. At Logansport Memorial, we're seeing higher numbers of patients in the self-pay, Medicare, or Medicaid categories which result in lower reimbursement rates on the services they need that we provide, no matter what. LMH absorbs the

difference between what it costs for the care provided and what is paid to the hospital for that care, which is reflected in these numbers. We do this because it's the right thing to do, and because it's part of our mission as a not-for-profit hospital."

Our purpose remains the same in this changing world of healthcare – to help improve the health and well-being of our community for all who call it home. Logansport Memorial Hospital opened its doors in 1925, and since then, these doors have been open to the community each and every day. Our tradition of addressing healthcare needs and providing benefits for our community will continue for many years to come.

From the LMH Foundation

Starting in 1984 and continuing through today, Logansport Memorial Hospital Foundation has raised millions of dollars to bring the necessary equipment and resources that our community hospital needs to provide excellent, patient-centered care.

2022 was a busy and exciting year for the Foundation, with annual events and special events like the tri-ennial "Up on the Roof Gala" taking place to raise funds for both general and specific needs across the hospital. The outpouring of support and generosity is what makes the high-quality healthcare possible that LMH is very proud to provide across the communities we serve.

The "Up on the Roof Gala" is a signature event for the Logansport Memorial Hospital Foundation, held every three years in August on top of the hospital's parking garage. A billowing tent transforms the concrete structure into an upscale venue.

A record crowd of more than 340 guests donated to raise more than \$125,000 for the hospital's Surgery Department, to help renovate, enhance, and modernize the surgical suites as part of a larger planned and phased capital improvement project.

Dr. Todd Weinstein, tenured general surgeon at Logansport Memorial and current Chief Medical Officer, shared his perspective on why this project for the surgical suites was so important for the hospital's future. His moving words inspired the generosity of many of the guests in attendance.

"Putting our patients first is very important to us, and these renovations have their safety, comfort, and convenience in mind. I believe this is a much needed project that will elevate our standards of surgical care and ensure that we can continue providing what our community needs, both now and in the future."



The meaningful gift from donors at this event has already started making a difference for patients having surgery at LMH in 2023. Plans for continuing the renovations and upgrades have been placed on hold during the hospital's time of transition, but donor funds from this event were stewarded before bringing the project to an appropriate pause. Resuming these renovations and upgrades is planned for capital project prioritization that will begin in 2024.
