



Questions about COVID-19 Testing

What is the cost of testing? How will I pay for it?

There is a cost for the COVID-19 test, and for the healthcare visit that you have with a provider as part of being tested. The combined cost for the COVID-19 test and healthcare visit is approximately \$190.00. No payment, including a co-pay, is due at the time of service.

- If you have insurance – the cost for testing and the visit will be billed to your insurance. You can work with a financial counselor for a reduced rate or reduced payment if you do not have the resources to cover the cost.
- If you are uninsured – the CARES Act will reimburse the hospital for the cost of your testing and healthcare visit.

What documents do you need to bring with you to get tested?

Any type of photo ID will be accepted, including a work ID. We just need to be able to verify that your face matches a picture on a form of ID.

If you are undocumented, can you get tested?

Yes – as long as you bring some form of photo ID, so that we can match your face to your ID.

If you are undocumented and you need documentation, can you use a Matricula (consular photo ID card) or passport?

Yes, any type of photo ID will be accepted.

If you have symptoms or have come in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, can you go to the testing at the fairgrounds?

Yes, you can be tested at the fairgrounds in both cases – if you have symptoms or if you have been exposed.

Do you need to call first or call another medical provider first?

Do not call first – the phones are very busy. It is walk-in only, no appointment needed. You will be directed about where to park when you get there. Stay in your car and put your flashers on – staff will come out to your car to screen you and decide if you need to go inside.

If you typically have a provider that you see for your healthcare needs, you can call their office first before coming out to the clinic to let them know of your symptoms or exposure.
