OVERVIEW OF 2020

Even though 2020 has been a challenging year for many, the Logansport Memorial Hospital Foundation has still been hard at work ensuring we continue gifting for health.

The board is honored to be able to make an impact on LMH, the employees and the communities we serve, when they all needed us more than ever. Big or small, the Foundation is excited to help!

WHERE YOUR DONATIONS WENT

- \$2,670 in direct patient care
- \$3,000 in scholarships
- \$21,183.89 in equipment purchases for Physical Therapy, Nutritional Services, Cancer Care Center and Surgery
- \$20,860.50 in trail maintenance for the River Bluff Trail

In addition to the donations above, the Foundation will be rounding out 2020 by giving additional capital donations to the hospital. The fourth installment of \$150,000, from LMHF's 2017 Capital Campaign total pledge of \$1.286 million will be disbursed in December towards the Cancer Care Center and the newly opened Family Birth Center. Furthermore, the Foundation will be contributing \$75,000 from their 2019 Up On The Roof Gala toward the purchase of LMH's new 3-D Mammography Unit.

VIRTUALLY RUNNING FOR A CURE

Even though we could not be together in person, our community stepped up and supported our cause, completing their 5K throughout the week. From Saturday, October 3 through Friday, October 9, participants shared with LMHF their photos, showing their support for the Foundation and our community. This year an estimated 276,480 women in the United States will be diagnosed with invasive breast cancer. If detected in early stages, an individual's survival rate increases by 95%. This year our 181 registered participants helped raise \$2,126.36, which covers 24 screening mammograms for uninsured/under-insured women over 40 right here in Cass County. Thank you to everyone who made this year's Virtual River Bluff Run and Walk a success.

 EQUIPMENT UPGRADES**

Making equipment purchases to support the various departments would not be possible without the support from the LMH employees who generously donate through our annual employee campaign. This year's employee campaign kicked off October 28, with a simple message "Give A Little, Help A Lot" and LMH's employees delivered. For 2021, the employees have committed over \$33,000 to support the Foundation's various funds through our annual employee campaign.

Thank you to all of the employees who support the Foundation and for helping us continue Gifting For Health.

This year the Foundation has been called upon to assist in purchasing multiple pieces of equipment that directly benefit the patients and staff. LMHF's equipment purchases for 2020

totaled over \$20,000 and were requested by various departments from a refrigerated table for Nutritional Services, a Glidescope for Surgery and a blanket warmer for the Cancer Center.

Therapy Services approached the Foundation in July with the need for a new arm bike for PT and OT patients. They had been using their old one for quite some time, making repairs more frequently than ever. The Therapy Services team does a wonderful job delivering the best care to their patients with the equipment they have, and this new piece of equipment is no exception. When asked about how the new arm bike was working out, the Therapy Services Team said, "The new Upper Body Ergometer will benefit many patients and allow staff to improve the outcomes for those patients. Thank you so much for purchasing it and we appreciate your support!"

**CONSTRUCTION UPDATE
 3-D MAMMOGRAPHY UNIT**

Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, LMH's Plant Engineering team has been hard at work on the renovation and construction of our new Breast Care Center. Currently, they are in the demolition stage of the process. They are working first on the areas for the new state-of-the-art 3-D mammography unit to keep things moving smoothly for current mammography services. The new Breast Care Center will be located on the main level of LMH, in the space that used to be Medical Records. Construction of the space and installation of the new 3-D Mammography is expected to be completed by early 2021.
