

NEW IMAGING PARTNERSHIP

Logansport Memorial Hospital is proud to provide many clinical services for our community so that patients can have a seamless care experience, with as many tests and procedures performed on-site as possible. One of the service areas that is very helpful in diagnosing, treating, and managing conditions or diseases is the medical imaging department. The physician specialists who interpret medical imaging test results are known as radiologists, and this year, LMH entered into a new partnership with a radiology group to offer more imaging options for our patients right here at home.

SUMMIT RADIOLOGY

LMH carefully evaluated potential partners when looking to improve the timeliness and efficiency of interpreting medical imaging results for other providers in our affiliated network. Summit Radiology is based out of Fort Wayne and serves hospitals across Indiana and in several surrounding states by providing radiology services on-site and remotely. On-site services give our providers access to the radiologist for any follow-up or additional discussion needed about test results, and remote services ensure that medical imaging results can be interpreted day or night, for any care situation that arises in an emergency or after-hours.

All physicians of Summit Radiology are graduates of accredited Radiology residency programs, and most have completed additional fellowship training in subspecialty fields such as Interventional Radiology, Body Imaging, Mammography, Neuroradiology, Musculoskeletal, and Nuclear Medicine.



- Arthrograms and Injections (Ankle, Elbow, Hip, Knee, Shoulder and Wrist)
- CT-Guided Biopsies
- Mammography procedures, including Stereotactic Breast Biopsy and Ultrasound-Guided Core Breast Biopsy
- Other various ultrasound-guided biopsies

PET/CT SCAN NOW AVAILABLE

Logansport Memorial Hospital also began offering PET/CT scans on-site for patients in 2018. This advanced imaging procedure combines two imaging scans into one procedure -- positron emission tomography (PET) and computed tomography (CT). A PET/CT scan reveals information about the structure and function of cells and tissues in the body during a single imaging session.

With the addition of the Logansport Memorial Cancer Care Center, PET/CT scans can be used to detect cancerous tissues and cells in the body that may not always be found through a standard CT scan or MRI. Our patients now have local access to enhanced imaging techniques for the comprehensive treatment of their cancer.

NEW SERVICE LINES TO LMH



Growing our network of affiliated providers continues to be a high priority for Logansport Memorial Hospital. It takes a team of primary care and specialty providers to deliver the true continuum of care for our patients, so that they don't have to travel out of town for specialized services. In years past, specialty services have been brought to LMH in partnership with providers who are not affiliated with our Logansport Memorial Physician Network. These partnerships exist to offer additional convenience for our patients. More recently, we have sought to find providers and specialists who want to join our affiliated network and assimilate into our community, to provide the care that's needed with the same commitment that we have to those we serve.

In 2018, we were fortunate to find two specialists in key service lines who shared that passion and commitment to delivering top-tier, personalized care. They are helping us expand access to specialty services for patients throughout our region.

RHEUMATOLOGY

One of the new services brought to LMH in 2018 for patients who suffer from painful arthritis or from frustrating autoimmune diseases was rheumatology. Dr. Steven Behrendsen is an internal medicine physician who is board-certified in rheumatology. He brings his additional education and experience in diagnosing and treating arthritis and other conditions affecting the joints, soft tissues, and connective tissues in the body to LMH for the benefit of our community.

Arthritis is a painful condition that can become debilitating and cause those affected by it to lose their quality of life. Patients suffering from severe, long-term joint and muscle pain may find their ability to work and care for themselves compromised. In these cases, additional support from diagnostic and therapeutic resources provided by a rheumatologist can help primary care physicians make a more accurate diagnosis and provide more focused care. In addition to treating arthritis, Dr. Behrendsen also specializes in diagnosing and treating complicated autoimmune diseases, such as Lupus and scleroderma. He is currently accepting new patients.

UROLOGY

Urology has long been offered through strategic partnerships at LMH to bring the needed services on-site and offer convenient access to them for our patients. In 2018, LMH successfully recruited a board-certified urologist with advanced fellowship training in the management of urological cancers to officially join our affiliated network of providers. This secured urology services to be provided five days per week for our patients in need.

Dr. Stephen Beck can help with a wide variety of issues related to the bladder and kidneys. Conditions that benefit from urologic treatment include kidney stones, bladder disorders (such as overactive bladder and incontinence), prostate problems, low testosterone, prostate cancer, recurrent urinary tract infections, and urologic cancers. When medication and other non-surgical treatments are either unavailable or cannot relieve symptoms, surgery is the recommended option for many of these conditions. Dr. Beck develops customized treatment plans for all of his patients, using all treatment options available to help restore your health and improve your quality of life. He is currently accepting new patients.

RENAMING THE FOOTBALL STADIUM

As part of this new partnership, the football stadium in the Logansport Community School Corporation was renamed "Logansport Memorial Hospital Stadium." A ribbon-cutting ceremony took place on Friday, August 24 to officially designate the stadium and celebrate this new community partnership.

Logansport Memorial Hospital is pleased to be bringing another new service to residents and families in Logansport, Cass County, and the surrounding counties of north central Indiana. The new Logansport Memorial Sports Medicine program launched at the beginning of the 2018-2019 school year features partnerships with local school corporations to provide on-site athletic training services and coverage to student athletes. These student athletes then have direct access to other necessary services, including orthopedics care and foot and ankle care, as well as closely coordinated follow-up care with physical therapy, all to deliver a comprehensive approach in maintaining their sports performance levels or in recovering from an athletic injury.

Logansport Memorial Sports Medicine serves varsity student athletes in the Logansport, Caston, Pioneer, Peru, and North Miami school corporations. An athletic trainer who is designated to serve each school will provide full-time coverage for various sporting events.

"While this program is new for us, it combines services that we already have in place to provide access to care that was previously missing for many of our local school corporations," comments Perry Gay, President and CEO of Logansport Memorial Hospital. "If student athletes at any of these school corporations were injured during a sporting event, they may have needed to travel some distance to receive proper care and treatment. With our board-certified athletic trainers now on the sidelines at each event, we can deliver the immediate care that's needed to address the injury until a more thorough assessment can be completed or more specialized care can be provided. Our team is led by our foot and ankle specialist Dr. Alex Lebrija, who serves as our medical director and will work closely with each athletic trainer in each school corporation to ensure the healthcare needs of their student athletes are met effectively and comprehensively."



In the Logansport Memorial Sports Medicine program, concussion screenings will also be offered regularly to each partner school so that athletes are kept safe from one of the most serious injuries to be sustained during a sporting event. The Logansport Memorial Sports Medicine team uses ImpACT® concussion screening and testing tools, which have been proven as an industry standard by the FDA and other regulatory agencies. The ImpACT® concussion screening has two components -- one for baseline testing and one for post-injury testing -- that are used together to determine if a student athlete can safely return to play or activity. Each athletic trainer in the Sports Medicine program is certified to use the ImpACT® tool and physicians in the Logansport Memorial Physician Network are able to interpret results quickly.
